

1999 to 2013; volume of public reports received vs. confirmed as Child Sexual Abuse Material (CSAM)



Ireland is part of a 12 month EU funded Project coordinated by INSAFE 8. INNODE in collaboration with INTERPOL aiming to achieve faster escalation of new CSAM images or videos to Law Enforcement where attempts can be made to identify new child victims of sexual abuse. Other participating countries: Germany, Finland, Bulgaria, Romania, Netherlands, Hungary, Austria and Poland.
