Working in cooperation with law enforcement, government, and industry partners, Irish Internet Hotline plays a vital role in protecting children, disrupting exploitation, and helping to make the internet a safer place for everyone.

## What To Report



### Child Sexual Abuse Material

Images, video, text, nonphotographic child sexual abuse content etc



### Child Sexual Exploitation

Activities relating to online child sexual exploitation e.g. child grooming



### Intimate Image Abuse

Intimate images and videos shared without the person's consent



### Racism And Xenophobia



### **Financial Scams**

Purporting to be Irish financial services or have Irish contact details or appears to have originated from Ireland

Since our establishment in 1999, the Irish Internet Hotline has worked to reduce the availability of illegal and harmful content online, disrupt cycles of abuse and exploitation, and contribute to the prevention of revictimisation.

We play a key role in Ireland's wider efforts to enhance cybersecurity, protect consumers, and uphold digital trust, addressing a growing range of online threats that impact individuals, organisations, and society.

The Irish Internet Hotline's work includes:

- Illegal online content, such as child sexual abuse material (CSAM) and activities relating to online child sexual exploitation.
- Intimate image abuse intimate or sexual images shared online without consent.
- Emerging online harms that intersect with cybersecurity, fraud, and digital safety.

You can securely, confidentially, and anonymously report suspected illegal or harmful online content at hotline.ie/report.

Each report is assessed by expert analysts against rigorous standards and in line with Irish law. When content is determined to be illegal, swift action is taken in cooperation with law enforcement, government, and industry partners.
